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#### Caring for the Community

Washington Township Health Care District provides many benefits to the community. One direct benefit that receives little notice is the health care that is provided for free or for which the District is not fully compensated. In the past year alone, Washington provided more than \$37 million in health care to the community's medically indigent population, \$3 million for unpaid medical costs, community education and other expenses, and an additional \$44 million for the uncompensated cost of care for Medicare patients and bad debt.

Washington opened its new Outpatient Imaging Center, featuring the most advanced, all-digital imaging technology available in one convenient location. The latest generation 64-slice CT scanner, combined with the added precision of industry-leading image quality, gives doctors access to some of the best diagnostic tools available in the world of health care today.

#### World-class care for neurological disorders

At the new Taylor McAdam Bell Neuroscience Institute, Washington has brought together leading experts and state-of-the-art technologies to treat patients with a wide range of neurological disorders. The Institute's five programs focus on highly effective, minimally invasive treatments. One of the cornerstones of the Institute is the world-class Gamma Knife® Program. Washington became the first hospital in North America and the first community hospital in the world to use the gold standard Leksell Gamma Knife® Perfexion™ to treat patients with malignant brain tumors and other serious brain disorders without making a single incision.

#### The highest standards for stroke care

Washington Hospital's Stroke Program has earned the Gold Seal of approval from the Joint Commission, the nation's leader in standards-setting and accreditation for health care. The Program is now designated as a Primary Stroke Center, only the second hospital in Alameda County to earn this distinction. At Washington, care and intervention for stroke is fast, efficient and highly coordinated, giving patients the best possible outcomes.

#### Services tailored to women's needs

Washington Women's Center gives women access to a centralized array of diagnostic and wellness services designed just for them and provided in a soothing environment. It also features the comprehensive Breast Health Program. The Center's unique concept is to offer advanced diagnostic services, an expert clinical staff and a host of wellness, support and education programs, combined with easy access to the extensive array of women's services throughout Washington Hospital Healthcare System.

#### Top quality education to fight diabetes

The Diabetes Program at Washington Hospital was awarded the prestigious American Diabetes Association Education Recognition Certificate for its excellent diabetes self-management education program. Experts from the Association commended Washington for its in-depth, individualized approach to teaching people with diabetes how to successfully manage their disease.
